ASH WEDNESDAY



On Ash Wednesday we begin our forty-day journey toward Easter. The invitation to the season of Lent reminds us that we enter this season together "with the whole church." We are created for communion with God, to love one another, and to live in harmony with creation. Though many common Lenten practices rightly invite us to individual acts of "repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving and works of love," Lent is also a time for the deepening of community. As we mark our foreheads with dust, we acknowledge that we, all of us, die and return to the earth. We confess and acknowledge that we are on this journey together in need of God and one another. The cross is a reminder of death and our participation in the communion of saints but also a reminder of our baptism into life and into the community of Christ. We are created for beloved community.

Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.


In life and in death, I belong to God.


After those who desire ashes have received them, the minister continues: We are marked with life and life everlasting, as individuals and as community, as what we are: one body in Christ. **Amen.**




