

Did you see the cactus that was made by the Finance Committee?


Curious about the scorpions and flowers?

# **Legacy Moment**First Lutheran Church Foundation

# What we learned from our May meeting with our friends from San Antonio los Ranchos (via Zoom):

What our scholarship students are doing: Alfredo is studying engineering & plans to work in the Los Ranchos area after he graduates; Veronica is studying public accounting & Wilbur is majoring in nutrition.

What the effects of weather are on crops: The rain is good except, it brings more heat from the ground. He said farmers are waiting to prepare the ground for corn planting. It takes 3 months to prepare the land.

**Loss:** Veronica's aunt passed away and another 2 community members passed away recently.

**Los Ranchos community news:** Confirmation was in April with 14 young people from Los Ranchos and 10 from Guarjila. A young man was baptized and also confirmed the same night and the church was full!

**News from US**: Our team told about the Driver's License for All bill that was passed in the MN legislature & that a Sanctuary State bill was introduced, but not acted on yet. We told about the Earth Day fair held at FLC & that a pollinator garden will be planted outside the church this summer

Planning for 25th anniversary of our first delegation: Ideas include: pictures of various delegations & events in our churches, something special in August when Los Ranchos celebrates the return of people from refugee camps, having former delegates talk about their delegation & its meaning on their life, having info on the scholarship program, conversations about our memories & why this connection was started, including what we do now & visioning what we can do to bring our connection into the future.

We praise you and give you thanks for your blessings on all immigrants, on those who cross all the borders in the United States. Today we pray for a clear and direct pathway to citizenship for all our people! We pray that You guide the hearts of policy makers, to make the right decisions, and be on the right side of history. Our team is learning from exciting new materials available from Episcopal Migration Ministries Rainbow Initiative which we are now a part of. There is a new Welcome Center being planned by a subcommittee of the Interfaith Committee for Migrant Justice, which will welcome newcomers (such as AS).

Our team is a part of ICMJ, which organized a showing of the Seeking Asylum film on World Refugee Day, followed by a panel discussion with local asylum seekers and sponsors.

#### Rhubarb Festival Thank You

How do we put into words our thanks for all the participation in the weeks leading up to and including the day of Rhubarb Fest? We asked and you delivered! From harvesting to chopping, to crusts, to pies, to crisps, to beans, to salsa, to jam, to burritos, to juice, to cleaning, to dishes, to leaf painting, to serving food, to eating food, to enjoying a day of community at the Rhubarb Festival at Stella Maris, the list goes on.

A large bouquet of rhubarb leaves goes to Mary Schmitz who handled all the FLC details (& there are many!). All Rhubarb Festival proceeds go straight to Chum programs. The need for Chum's services continues to grow. It takes \$1,000 to shelter 50 people each night. And most nights Chum has over 100 guests.

In 2022 Chum served 1,364 individuals:

- 935 of them report having a disability for a long time.
- 718 of them report having a serious mental illness.
- 515 of them were chronically homeless (people who are chronically homeless have experienced homelessness for at least a year, or repeatedly).

Chum is the biggest safety net in Duluth for people experiencing homelessness, hunger, and poverty.

When life throws people a curveball, Chum is there to help them get back on their feet.

Thank you for supporting the work of Chum. Many hands and hearts contributed to the success of the day.

We thank you for your generosity of your time and talents.

### What's Going on in the Basement? Teen Closet, of course!

If you brave the basement passages, you just might see the busy Teen Closet Team at work, sorting, stocking, decorating, and generally preparing the store for teen shoppers. Lutheran Social Service of MN operates and staffs the Teen Closet to serve their teen participants (13-21-ish years) and teens from other programs across the area. School social workers and other teen advocates also refer teens to the store. Teen Closet has posted shopping hours which you can see in FLC publications and shoppers can make personal appointments with LSSMN staff. A few minutes or a few hours of your time will make a difference in the lives of local teens. Consider supporting this ministry in one of these ways:

- Check the Needs List regularly and contribute in-kind donations
- Bring new or gently used teen clothing items and shoes to the donation bins in the Gathering Space or behind the Youth Room
- Check the Clearance Racks when you shop with Teen Closet in mind
- Volunteer to help a list of Workdays is in FLC publications some tasks can be done independently like exporting unneeded items to other outreach groups
- Bring teen/young adult books to stock the Little Library by the Canopy Entrance
- Spread the word. There are teens that aren't being reached and we want to support them too!
- Pray for new ways that FLC can serve this demographic.
- Join the Teen Closet Text Group to be notified about Workdays
- Invite local businesses to support this cause. Thank Maurices and Penney's staff for their regular donations.

# South Sudanese Leadership & Community Development (SSLCD)

It is striking that we often think of refugees as people who are merely recipients of our giving. And yet, South Sudanese refugees living in settlements in northern Uganda made the striking decision in March to go green. To further this end, they have begun an initiative to plant 2,000 trees in 2023. They hope to lessen their carbon footprint and to care for the land in the country that has been housing them. The majority of refugees are women and girls, and they are the ones responsible for the planting, watering, and overall care and nurturing of the trees.

This community development effort is supported by FLC to empower refugee women and girls to make a qualitative difference in the life of their settlements as they continue in exile, waiting for war to stop in their home country.
