He continues working with a mentor learning English during the time school is on break.

If you are looking for a new novel to read, Lezlie suggests *The Wind Knows My Name* by Isabel Allende (2023). It's available at the Duluth Public Library and booksellers everywhere.

Welcome Center Update: The subcommittee has found a home at Trinity Lutheran Church, located on 8th St. in East Hillside! Trinity has offered the subcommittee a large room that they and local asylum seekers (and other migrants) can call their own. The subcommittee is now developing volunteer run programs and services. South Sudanese Leadership and Community Development Project

Through this project, South Sudanese refugee women are working to plant, weed, and harvest 98 acres of land, which is rented from Northern Ugandan farmers. Because it is semi-arid land, the women are able to plant and harvest twice each year. Working in cooperatives, they grow the food to feed their families and the most vulnerable in the settlements. After harvesting and drying their crops, they take them to the granary, which is also a cooperative run by refugee women supported by this project. The grinding process allows them to store and preserve their food more efficiently. Because of this project, women and girls are transforming their lives and the life of their settlement through leadership development and economic empowerment. Women make up about 85% of the population of the camp. -Denise Scheer

Update from Petrozavodsk, Russia

Pastor Alex Krongolm and Nadia continue to serve their congregation in Petrozavodsk by making weekend trips with their 2 young children from Finland to Petrozavodsk. This trip involves a risky border crossing (fear of being conscripted into the Army) and is exhausting. Alex has completed his classes, but is fulfilling an internship in Finland, which means departing at 5 p.m. Friday and returning by 8 a.m. Monday.

Despite the emotional and financial toll of the Russia-Ukraine war, under Alexei's leadership and an active Church Council and lay leadership, the congregation is continuing their ministry of care and outreach. In July, the congregation held a Youth and Family Retreat, hosted an event for physicians and medical personnel in Petrozavodsk to provide medical and spiritual help for those in need, and hosted several concerts for the community, while also carrying on their program of humanitarian aid for Ukrainian refugees.

Nadia has been able to secure medical attention through the Finnish health care system and there is hope for a diagnosis and possible treatment soon — current thinking is related to a compromised immune system.

FLC member Paul Anderson has stepped down as Coordinator of Vision Petrozavodsk, but will continue as a member, along with Carol, of the Advisory Committee; Sue Brezny from Saint James Lutheran Church in W. St. Paul is the new Coordinator. (Paul will also continue to serve on our N.E. MN Synod/Russian Lutheran Church Companion Synod Task Force.)

Urgent financial needs include a reliable car for Pastor Alex; the Vision Petrozavodsk Advisory Committee is pursuing options for how to raise the needed funds.

Teen Closet

Teen Closet is a program of Lutheran Social Services through the Center for Changing Lives. The program serves youth aged 13 through early twenties who are in need for a variety of reasons. LSS communicates with other local youth-serving agencies to encourage use of the Closet. First Lutheran's role is that of suport. FLC volunteers sort donations, stock the store and provide a welcoming atmosphere for teen shoppers. In August LSS hired Allison Bartlett who will oversee the Closet. Allison has scheduled **Teen Closet shopping hours each Thursday from 2-7 pm.** Please spread the word in the community about this fabulous resource for teens in need of clothing.
